



CP-02-007 – NAMING OF PUBLIC PLACES

1. Names for public places, streets, squares, buildings, parks, parking lots and so forth shall consider the following criteria:
 - A. Neighborhood, boundary roads, or common usage identification;
 - B. A natural or geographic feature;
 - C. Significant historical events or cultural attributes;
 - D. Area sons and daughters;
 - E. Past contributions to the community's social, cultural, economic, educational, and/or political heritage; and
 - F. Unique elements of the community's physical environment.

Names of present City officials or employees shall not be used except in the case where recognition is being given for accomplishments outside of City service.

2. When it becomes necessary to select a name or names, the relevant City Committee (Planning, Parks and Recreation, Parking District, etc.) shall, pursuant to public hearing, submit a recommendation to the City Council.

From the recommendations submitted, and pursuant to public hearing, the Council shall select and designate the appropriate name or names.

3. This policy shall apply only to the selection of names by the City. Though private parties are encouraged to consider this policy in selecting names for buildings, subdivisions, streets, etc., they are not required to comply with the policy.
